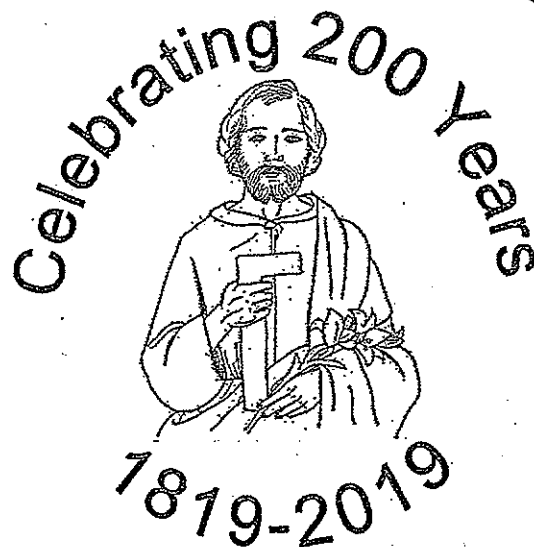

Mark My Words

In this article, I will give an overview of Lent and a brief review of the Holy Days during Lent & Holy Week. Lent is a 40-day liturgical season which begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Thursday. The Easter Triduum begins on Holy Thursday and concludes on Easter Vigil. Sundays are not included in the 40 days of Lent since every Sunday is a celebration of Jesus' resurrection. Lent has long been a tradition in the Catholic Church and is believed to recall the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness fasting and being tempted by Satan. Lent is considered a time of penance and discipline. During Lent, you may give something up, perform acts of charity, devote more time for prayer, donate your money and/or time to charitable causes, and many other options. The key is to do something. Whatever extraordinary things you're doing during Lent, offer them up to God.

Because of Lent's penitential nature, the vestment colors change to purple or violet during this liturgical season. Some churches remove flowers from the Sanctuary and eliminate songs of praise, such as "Glory to God in the highest", and expressions of joy, such as the "Alleluia" exclamation, during the Mass.

We celebrated Ash Wednesday as the first day of Lent on March 6. On that day, Catholics around the world focused on their complete sinfulness and the necessity of Jesus' suffering and death for their salvation. In the Old Testament, ashes are referred to as signs of sorrow, mourning, humility, and mortality. Ashes are used on Ash Wednesday to remind people of their mortality when these words are expressed, "you are dust and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19).

Palm Sunday begins the last week of Lent, known as Holy Week. During this holiest time of the church year, the focus is on the final week of our Lord's human life. Holy Week includes Holy Thursday, when Christians observe Jesus' Last Supper and the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood. Good Friday commemorates the imprisonment, trial, and death of Jesus. At Saturday's Easter Vigil, Christians gather in darkness, light a new fire, and celebrate the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. These three days, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil, are the holiest of days and are called the Triduum.

As a reminder, please take part in the various activities scheduled in our parish during this Lenten season. On Tuesdays, at 7:00-8:30pm, in the school cafeteria, I am leading a Bible study. We have Stations of the Cross at 10:45am on Thursdays and at 7:00pm on Fridays. On Fridays, the Stations of the Cross are followed by Benediction. We have Exposition of the Blessed Eucharist in church on Sundays after the 8:00am Mass until approximately 10:00am. We continue to have our regular hours of Exposition in the church and the chapel in the church basement. Scheduled times for confession continue to be offered and know that I will make myself available, if humanly possible, for special requests for confession. Alpha will be starting in late March. Our delicious Friday "Fish Frys" began on March 8 and will continue through April 19.

I will pray for you during this Lenten season. May God continue to bless each of you.

Religious Education "In"-Formation



The Temptation of Christ Luke 4:1-13

The choices that we make each day and each week tell us much about our priorities. In particular, how we choose to spend our time can tell us a lot about what is important to us. What do your choices tell you about your priorities?

One of the greatest temptations we face is to be careless about the use of our time. This temptation can lead us to neglect spending time and energy on important things. Let's think of some examples. For example, sometimes we are tempted to devote more time to watching television than doing our homework or helping with household chores.

On the first Sunday of Lent, we hear about how Jesus was tempted by the devil in the desert. In each of the temptations described, Jesus was faced with the choice of spending his time and energy on activities that would lead him away from God. Let's read today's Gospel to learn how Jesus makes his decision about these temptations. They surely are an example for us.

Luke 4: 1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live on bread alone.'" Then he took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a single instant. The devil said to him, "I shall give to you all this power and glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I may give it to whomever I wish. All this will be yours, if you worship me." Jesus said to him in reply, "It is written: You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Then he led him to Jerusalem, made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written: He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you, and: With their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." Jesus said to him in reply, "It also says, You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." When the devil had finished every temptation, he departed from him for a time.


What were the three things that the devil tempted Jesus to do? To turn stone to bread to prove he was the Son of God; to worship the devil to receive power and glory; and to jump off a high place to test God. **What did Jesus show was of greatest importance to him in the choices that he made?** Jesus chose to trust God and to reflect this value in each of his choices.

During Lent we can think more carefully about how we spend our time. We might choose to spend more time and energy on activities that lead us to God. Jesus' response to the devil's temptations reminds us that God is to take priority in our lives. Our Lenten practices prepare us to choose God above everything else in our lives.

Write personal prayers for Lent indicating things that you will choose and things that you will give up to show that God has the place of greatest importance in your life. Pray the Act of Love prayer during this Lenten season.

On my God, I love you above all things with my whole heart and soul, because you are all good and worthy of all my love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of you. I forgive all who have injured me and I ask pardon of those whom I have injured. Amen.
